To the Leeton Public School community

I want to say a huge "thankyou" to all of you who have followed and supported our world record cycle around Australia and fundraising efforts for the Royal Flying Doctor Service. Your support was part of the incredible interest in our event from all across Australia and indeed around the world. We have been stunned by the amount of involvement in the event, even since the conclusion of the race, with just over 900 000 hits on our website since its inception in March until the end of November.

At 4:49am on Thursday 20th October, QLD police officer and father of three, Dave Alley, supported by the incredibly hard working Race Around Australia crew, set a new WORLD RECORD for the fastest ever ride around Australia on a bicycle. In the process we have raised over \$20,000 for the Royal Flying Doctor Service, an iconic Australian organisation responsible for saving the lives of countless Australians over many years. Dave cycled 14,251km in 37 days, 20 hours and 45 minutes at an incredible average of 377km per day. This is the same distance as riding from Leeton to Canberra and some of the back again every single day for over 37 days in a row. We are very proud Australians and enjoying what we have achieved.

This achievement has been an amazing team effort – we couldn't have done it without all those people who have contributed in some way. It all came from my mate and I firstly creating, and then making the absolute most of a fantastic OPPORTUNITY. As all students at Leeton Public School know, I constantly talk to all of you about opportunities. I hope you can now see what you can achieve if you take an opportunity and follow your dreams. Every single person is capable of achieving anything you want if you channel your mind and energies to it. But if you really want to achieve your dream, you must stay focused throughout. You need to overcome your doubts, overcome the doubts and negativity of others, stay strong to yourself and those who believe in what you are doing. If you plan, prepare thoroughly and maintain a great work ethic, you can realise your dreams and achieve extraordinary things.

I am fully aware that many people doubted that this could be done and said that it would be impossible. Some people even said that I should not take the time to be a part of it. Such comments and sentiments just took my already high degree of determination and stubbornness to another level, so for that I say

thankyou! We overcame many difficult moments and extreme challenges before and during the race. But we remained focused and committed throughout and were always going to stick solid to our original plan, whether we beat the record or not.

There were many highlights, too many to name them all. To have an 80 year old man cycle 55km to the finish line just to say "thankyou" because the Royal Flying Doctor Service once saved his life will be something that will stay with me forever. Another lady knew we were approaching in the Northern Territory, and drove out from her property over 70km off the road just to donate and wish us well as she also had a previous lifesaving experience courtesy of the Flying Doctors. To have so many schools involved from across Australia was also very motivating. There are many creative, innovative and dynamic teachers across this great country who provided some highly engaging learning activities for some very talented students. It was great to learn about the wide range of things students were involved with through our website and their own innovation and research. Thankyou to those from LPS who were involved in this way. It was great to find out what you were doing in class and it was very uplifting to read your messages of support as the race progressed.

I want to thankyou all for your contribution to your recent fundraising day and "Dance Around Australia" inspired by the incredibly enthusiastic and talented Mrs Whelan. I know Mrs Whelan would have worked hard with the dance group to create a great show for you all. To raise over \$400 was a terrific effort and one that you should all be proud of. I know the *Royal Flying Doctor Service* are extremely grateful.
