# Cricket

Last Friday the Leeton Public School cricket team travelled to Narrandera to participate in the first rounds of the Brian Taber Shield. The knockout competition featured teams from Parkview Public School, Narrandera Public School and a Barbarians side which featured LPS players, Dylan Gordon, Kyeffer Leach, Sam Harrison and Thomas Parr. These boys were reserves for our side and gained valuable experience and enjoyment from the day and are thanked for their commitment.

Leeton's first match was against Narrandera Public and having lost the toss were sent in to bat. Team captain Harrison Rudd led from the front, opening the batting and retiring with 25. He was ably supported by his opening partner, Jye Doyle, who scored 21. Nathan Ryan added a late cameo with his 11 taking Leeton towards their total of 112. Narrandera's Jack Williamson bowled tightly and finished with 2-6.

The boys set about defending their total with a strong team effort in the field restricting Narrandera's scoring opportunities. Tye Clancy was unplayable and bowled tightly to garner 1-3 off his three overs. Matthew Ryan produced a dangerous over, claiming a double wicket maiden on his way to 2-7. With everyone given the opportunity to roll the arm over, Reece Grundy, Nathan Baulch and Nathan Ryan took one wicket each and the team confined Narrandera to a score of 63. Leeton contributed the bulk of the total through their extras on a skinny Narrandera wicket which gave them something to think about before their next match.

With Parkview having beaten the Barbarians, the traditional rivals clashed to see who would make it through to the next round. Once again the toss was won by the opposition and the boys had to back up again in the field. Rudd and Doyle opened the bowling with Harrison making the early breakthrough, however this brought the dangerous Jack Quinlivan to the crease. His lusty hitting raced him towards 21 as Parkview looked to push on. After taking some stick in his first over, Tye Clancy responded with a wicket maiden including the removal of the dangerous Quinlivan. Braith Schmetzer (0-2) and Kye Davis (0-5) bowled tightly at the death overs. The pressure forced Parkview to chase runs which lead to an incredible 5 run outs to which Byron Tarlinton should be credited for keeping a cool head and soft gloves behind the stumps.

Leeton were set a target of 79 to progress to the next round of the Brian Taber Shield but the chase did not start well. Tyler O'Connell struck early to have Leeton at 2-4 until Harrison Rudd combined with opener Matthew Ryan for a 51 run partnership. Harrison once again showed his skill and retired on 26 and although Matthew failed to score he performed the anchor role needed to wrestle the momentum back. Parkview brought their opening bowlers back on and Reece Keech struck twice and O'Connell once to finish with 2-8 and 3-8 respectively from their four overs. At a precarious 5-62, Tyrone Watts fought back with some hitting of his own. His 18\* and Nathan Ryan's 2\* guided the boys home with 4 overs to spare. Leeton now progress to the next round of the competition which will be in 2014.

All the players on the day were congratulated on the level of their cricket especially the quality of their fielding. The students from Leeton Public School deserve special recognition for their behaviour on the day and their ability to be organised and responsible for themselves whilst their supervising teacher, Mrs Tiffin, was scoring each game. A special thank you to all



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the parents who drove the kids over to Narrandera and helped out in many facets during the day. As a former junior cricketer it was fantastic to see so many parents watching the boys play and the influence of such support is immeasurable.
