The day started with a rumble of thunder, which delayed start of play by 30 minutes. Skies were dark grey and a strong wind was blowing. LPS won the toss and chose to bat. Tom Allen was off to a sizzling start, with two 4's and a 6. He was run out on 18. Jayden Broadbent then switched from support roll to striker of the ball. He made an impressive 29 before being given out LBW. Charlie Lamont came in to bat, but was still recovering from a week at State Championships and was out for a duck. Blake McDonald arrived at the crease to some less than ideal conditions. Stop-start play due to rain followed. Flynn Anthony was dismissed without scoring, Logan Mahalm contributed 6 before being caught, Cohen Matthews was bowled for 7 and Jhi Grundy was also bowled for 4. 


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LEETON HIGH SCHOOL HAPPENINGS

2LS: This term we continue our whole school literacy focus and look to add to our use of the Literacy Continuum to support student learning. 2LS is a Riverina grown initiative to build teachers' capacity to implement effective strategies that equip all students with powerful learning skills. 2LS helps us better our reading and comprehension of texts by developing our skills in Summarising, Visualising, Predicting, Questioning, Making-Connection, Self-Monitoring and Inferring (known as the Super 7). The first of the Super 7 strategies that we are focussing on is Summarising. A summary is a shortened version of a text that contains all the main points. Summarising is an important skill that helps when we are researching, gathering and presenting information. Finding key words and phrases helps to summarise the text. These skills are essential for all students to gain a deeper understanding of what they are reading.
