Showbag purchases and pre-orders will be available for collection during the afternoon!

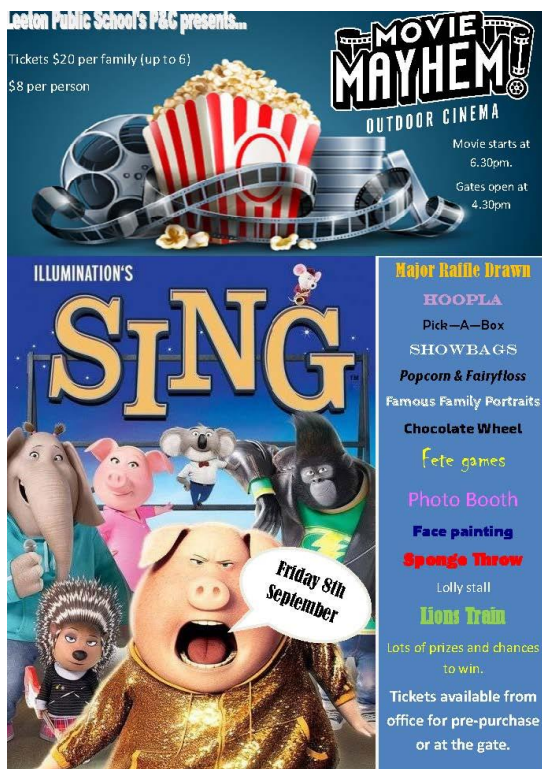

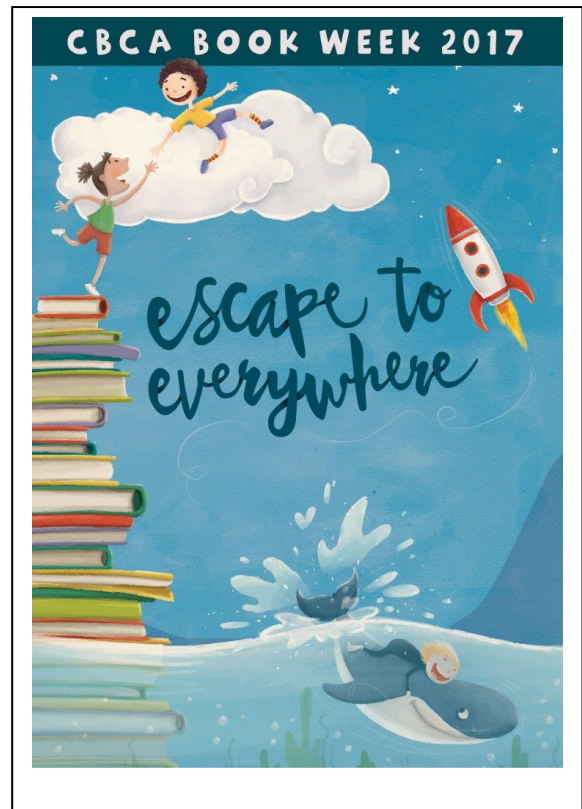
### Festival of Choral Music 2017

### What is How2learn?

#### Habits in Focus Week 8

**Imitation** - Picking up the skills, behaviours and values of others (Reciprocity: The social aspects of learning utilise the power of social capital)

**Questioning**- Getting below the surface: playing with situations

(Resourcefulness: The cognitive aspects of learning are about thinking in clever, effective ways. Keep an eye out for updates about HOW2Learn and the essential learning habits in coming newsletters!)



## 12. Questioning *looks and sounds like:*

Using questions to build curiosity.

Creating, asking and answering questions for different purposes.

Using strategies to get the most out of questioning.

I asked a challenging question that made people think.

I asked for more time or additional information when I did not know the answer to a question.

I provided evidence to support my response to a question.

I followed a series of scaffolded questions to help me solve a problem in Mathematics.

I created and asked a range of question types, e.g. *open, closed, direct, rhetorical*.

I was confident when asking a question.

I asked a question that was relevant to our topic.

I considered when different types of questions would be used.

I used wait time after asking someone a question.

I used a series of questions to help guide me through the inquiry process.



## 8. Imitation *looks and sounds like:*

Imitating to strengthen and accelerate learning.

Imitating to explore personal and social behaviours.

I identified a 'more knowledgeable other' to learn from.

When I watched somebody do something it helped my learning.

I 'piggybacked' or built on another person's idea as a way of enhancing my learning.

I watched someone closely before having a go at it myself.

I recognised the differencing between 'cheating' and 'learning from others'.

I observed the body language and expressions of others to help me understand them better.

If I practise whilst watching someone else I know it helps me learn.

I can learn at a faster rate by imitating someone else who has that skill.

I used a strategy suggested by someone else to find the answer.

I can pick up good habits by imitating others.

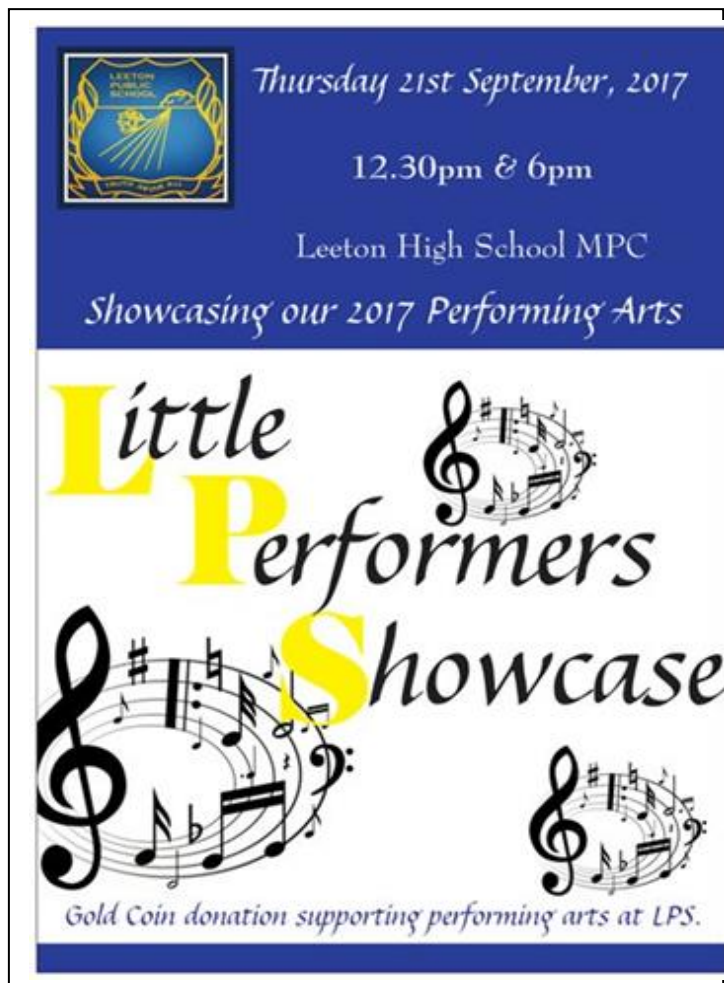
I modelled something for others to learn from me.
