### **PRINCIPAL'S REPORT**

Dear Parents, Carers and Community Members

### What an incredible year!

Despite the challenges, we were able to continue with our unique and innovative programs such as the Leeton High School Learning Links program which supports students to prepare for a successful life after school. Thank you to the many generous businesses, organisations and individuals who provided their expertise and resources to assist our students to reach their goals. Leeton High School is very grateful for these great partnerships forged as part of this program. COMPACT empowered our young ladies across Years 7-10 through their amazing work around building resilience, self-esteem, confidence and positive relationships. Leeton Shire Council generously supported our Aboriginal Boys' Cultural Program by releasing Mr. William Ingram to share his knowledge with our students through weekly culture sharing sessions.

Our Hands on Learning program has gone from strength to strength providing an alternate learning experience for diverse groups of students. Our teachers and artisans have facilitated amazingly creative opportunities for our students to learn different skills over the course of the year such as authentic pasta making, building internal walls, the fineries of plumbing, making a fully functioning pizza oven, paving, rendering, furniture restoration and construction, painting and decorating, cement work and slab construction. In working on these projects, students were able to utilise and develop their literacy and numeracy skills as part of their planning and activities and were able to work with a range of students from different years.

We remain committed to our involvement as an early adopter school of the High Potential and Gifted Education Policy. We are currently closely working through the policy to identify ways in which we can better develop the intellectual, social-emotional, physical, creative needs and talents of our students. We have continued to build the profile of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) in the school and now have two elective classes for students in Years 9 and 10 which is a great platform to further develop the knowledge and skills of our students and teachers..

While many activities and opportunities were not to be this year, our students still excelled. Four students in Year 9, Jana Deaton, Madeline Irvin, Jessica Wells and Kathleen Metre had their beautiful work published in the Ash Dust Air Poetry Anthology launched in Wagga and the very talented Amelie Sachs in Year 12 has been nominated for Encore, a musical initiative which showcases a selection of superior music pieces from HSC Music students across the state. Additionally, we have just received confirmation that Leeton High School is now partnered with Leeton Shire Council Arts Unit to be the principle partner for the 2021 Henry V Shakespearean masterpiece to be performed here in Leeton which will provide our students and teachers with exclusive and quality exposure to the art of acting and directing and specialists such as choreographers, set designers, lighting and sound experts. Jamwich 2020 provided an inspiring platform for live music last week and I applaud the students and teachers who performed in front of their peers. It was a thoroughly enjoyable experience, unique to Leeton High School. Auditions for Shrek – the Musical 2021 has also drawn an enthusiastic response from students with great numbers seeking a lead or an ensemble role. Can't wait to see this production evolve.

Wellbeing has continued to be a vital focus and important issues and resources are shared during our Year Meetings every Friday with students and staff. As a Positive Behaviour for Learning school, we have worked hard to promote positive behaviours framed around our values of being respectful, responsible, learners. To date, our students have been acknowledged 27,705 times for demonstrating these values by our staff which is an amazing effort!!!

With the new school planning process for 2021-2024 well on its way, we have committed to focusing on our students' growth and attainment in Reading and Numeracy, through refined teaching practices and greater collaboration and to enrich, engage and recognise not only our students and staff but to develop the huge potential in everyone here at Leeton High School. We are future focussed and will continue to be innovative in creating bold new approaches and opportunities for improved learning and wellbeing.

We farewelled an incredibly resilient Year 12 and were able to invite family members to share in this significant occasion and we hosted a Graduation Dinner which was livestreamed so parents could participate with us. We also welcomed Year 6 finally onsite for our Orientation program and we can't wait to see our newest students next year. We also recently celebrated our student's achievements at Presentation Day on 10th December. I would like to congratulate all award winners for their stellar efforts this year across academic, sporting, cultural and citizenship domains and express my appreciation to our special guest presenter and award providers. We very much appreciate your interest, generosity and support.

Thank you to all our teachers, support, administration and grounds staff for their commitment to our students and school and to

our generous and dedicated P&C who have tirelessly supported our school with their honest feedback, substantial donations and fundraising. The P&C meets every  $4^{\rm th}$  Tuesday of the month at 7pm in the school Library. All welcome.

### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

### **Early Warning Signs:**

Most families can tell when something is out of the ordinary, but there are also signs that suggest a child or young person may be experiencing a mental health problem. These include:

- not enjoying or wanting to be involved in things they normally enjoy,
- concentration difficulties,
- changes in appetite or sleeping patterns,
- being angry for no reason or easily irritated,
- difficulty coping at school,
- seeming stressed, down, worried or crying for no reason,
- expressing negative thoughts,
- · engaging in risky behaviours, or
- relationship difficulties.

### Suggestions to help young people stay healthy & build positive mental health. Encourage them to:

- be nice to themselves,
- make a list of things they like doing, and do them more often,
- · get involved with family and friends or do something nice for someone else,
- be conscious of things that make you feel strong and good.
- try to work on what they can control,
- be active, eat well & sleep well,
- find at least one thing that makes them laugh every day,
- ask for help & get support if needed- it's ok to say 'I'm not ok'
