
Dear Parents, Carers and Community Members

We love to learn in Tan! Some of our favourite subjects include: Maths, Dance, Art and Sport.





#### PEER SUPPORT TRAINING

On Thursday and Friday of this week, all Year Six students will be off-site, participating in Peer Support Leader Training. This training will equip the Year 6 students to implement the Peer Support Program across the school.

During the two days, the students will participate in activities and discussion to assist in the development of skills in: relationship building, communication, empathy, decision making, problem solving, reflection, facilitation, planning and group management

We will then commence our Peer Support lessons in early Term 3. The whole school participates in Peer Support for 30 minutes each week. Year 6 Peer leaders facilitate a small group of 8-9 younger students, who work together through a number of structured activities. Each teacher will supervise 3 groups in their classroom.

We encourage you to talk to your children about Peer Support every week, as it will help to reinforce the concepts learned in each session. If you have any concerns or questions about the program, please don't hesitate to contact us or your child's classroom teacher.






#### **Student Sentral Portal**

# Works notification

#### 25 June 2020

Dear parents/carers,

Upcoming planned maintenance works at Leeton Public School will require the removal of asbestos containing material. Testing conducted by an independent hygienist has confirmed that the material is bonded asbestos, which means it is attached to other material such as cement or vinyl and cannot be crumbled by light pressure.

This material will be removed in accordance with the Department of Education's Asbestos Management Plan and SafeWork NSW regulations. All work will be completed by licensed and accredited asbestos removalists, and monitored by occupational hygienists in strict accordance with all applicable legislation, regulations, policies and guidelines.

The material is scheduled to be removed during the upcoming school holidays on Monday 6 July 2020.

Testing will be completed to ensure the site has been fully remediated. We will keep you informed if further material is found which requires removal.

The health, safety, and well-being of the school and the local community is our highest priority. Please be assured that the removal of this material will not pose a risk to the local community.
