
#### Welcome to Week 10 Term 3


#### Footy Colours day Friday 25th September (Last day of term 3)

The students then made their own inferences after looking at stimulus pictures. In guided reading groups, we matched information from the text with an inference.

We have also been viewing and having a go at writing persuasive texts. We wrote a letter to Mrs Thomason to convince her to make cupcakes in

the new kitchen.











In art we made these fantastic drip crayon paintings after reading 'The Day the Crayons Quit' and made 3D city artworks.

We have been having loads of fun in mathematics, creating

data displays. We got to eat smarties and paddle pops and created picture graphs based on what we had in our smartie boxes and what our

All debaters have worked very hard to develop their skill set and show excellent potential. They are to be congratulated on their personal growth as well as their arguing abilities!




