Leeton High School Year 6

On Wednesday 31st March from 9.45am to 11 am our Year 6 students will visit Leeton High School to participate in a workshop coordinated by Headspace focused on supporting students to manage the changes involved in transition from primary to secondary school. The workshop will focus on:

- Understand how transition and change can impact mental health
- How to manage stress from change
- Build resilience and healthy coping skills
- Strengthen connection and belonging

Year 5 Opportunity Class placements

The application process for Year 5 opportunity class placement for entry in 2022 is about to begin.

Important dates in the application process are as follows:



- Tuesday 20th April 2021: Online applications opens
- Friday 7th May 2021: Online applications closes (Parents and carers must apply by the due date.)
- Tuesday 11th May 2021: Principals' processing site opens
- Friday 28th May 2021: Principals' processing site closes
- Wednesday 21st July 2021: Opportunity Class Placement Test
- Parents and carers must apply online between Tuesday 20th April 2021 and Friday 7th May 2021 at:

What are opportunity classes? Opportunity classes cater for academically gifted students with high potential who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates of their own academic standard. These classes help these students to learn by grouping them with students of similar ability, using specialised teaching methods and materials. Year 5 enrolments are available at 76 primary schools including a virtual opportunity class at Aurora College for students in rural and remote areas. Parents apply when their children are in Year 4. Successful students are offered placement, and if the parents accept the offer, the students attend the opportunity class full time inYears 5 and 6 at the relevant public school. This is a two-year placement program and there is no provision to apply for Year 6 entry only. In the majority of cases, students who accept a place in an opportunity class will leave their current school to attend the school with the opportunity class.





Leeton Public School App

Leeton Public School has an App which allows you to access our school with ease. The App allows parents to access our newsletters, the webpage and other important information with ease

A great feature of our App is the ability for parents to put in absent notes directly to the school. No more written notes required when you use the apps. The notes are emailed directly to the school where they are forwarded to the class teacher.



Today Parents and Carers will receive a letter explaining the 2021 School contributions. These contributions are greatly appreciated and support our school to access additional learning and technology resources.

The contributions for 2021 has been set at \$40 for the first child, \$40 for the second child and \$20 per child thereafter.

The 2021 contribution will also include subscription to Reading Eggs/Reading Express, Mathseeds and Mathletics both at home and school. These online individualised programs make learning interesting and engaging with great online games, tasks and activities.

As always, I would like to reiterate to all parents that if you have a concern or query regarding your child's education please make an appointment to see the relevant classroom teacher or appropriate Executive Member to further discuss the matter. Parents are asked to address any emails to our school email address. These emails will then be forwarded to the appropriate teacher. It is important that concerns be initially addressed with classroom teachers as often issues can be addressed quickly.

We joined 264 other schools across NSW in a "salad" effort to break the record for the most children eating vegetables simultaneously.

44,296 students crunched together and a further 12,687 students crunched over Vegetable Week. Although that was an awful lot of vegetable eating, it wasn't quite enough to break the 2018 and 2019 records. So "lettuce" keep practicing and "peas" join us again next year.

FAMILY FAVOURITE RECIPES AND SNACK IDEAS

If you want your family to eat more vegetables, you need to keep putting them on the table. Make it the norm in your house that vegetables are included at most meals and snacks.

ne simple tips

Add extra vegetables to your regular family dishes. Many of your family's favourite meals are going to be super-easy to include more vegetables into. Think pasta sauces, curries, stir-fries, burgers, fajitas and pizzas.

Use frozen and canned vegetables if cost, availability and/or time are an issue.

Put a plate of cut up veg out and ready to go for those pre-dinner hungry hands! You can even add smashed avocado or a legume dip (e.g. hommus) to jazz it up!

Include vegetables in your family's after school and weekend snack options. Try:

 toasties/jaffles with baked beans, tomato, avocado, mushrooms and/or spinach vegetable fitters, slices or muffins
 vegetable soup
 mini vegetable pizzas
 san chop bao or lettuce cup tacos

Options to try include: vegetable sticks such as celery, capsicum, carrot and cucumber; cold cooked vegetables such as corn cobs, small potatoes or leftove dinner vegetables; canned legumes (e.g. butter beans, cannellini beans or edamame beans); frozen vegetable pieces in a container (e.g. peas, com and carrot mixes); or even whole raw vegetables such as carrots, cherry tomatoes, beans, and mushrooms.

goodies for recess or morning tea? Think pumpkin scones, zucchini silice, pea fritters or corn muffins. Serving sandwiches, wraps or rolls for lunch? You can add the usual suspects like lettuce, tomato and cucumber but why not try branching out with something more likely to get the kids excited about veg:



SO HOW DO YOU ENCOURAGE YOUR FAMILY TO EAT MORE VEG?

Talk up the experience. When you and your kids are eating vegetables, talk about the bright colours, the varying tastes and textures of vegetables and how people feel after eating vegetables.

Avoid telling your kids to eat veg be are healthy. Kids live in the moment! How they feel right now means more to them than long term health outcomes. vegies in your kids' meals and snacks or hiding them so they don't know, they won't learn to eat them. Be patient, the more you offer them, the more likely they'll try them eventually.

Make it easy and available...especially when they are



We currently have 36 Riverina representatives who will participate in a variety of sports including swimming, basketball, rugby league and netball at upcoming NSW CHS carnivals! Our Parents and Citizens Association is offering funding assistance to support parents/carers meet the costs of competing at Riverina or state level. P&C funding application can be returned to the school's front office to be considered at the next P&C meeting to be held on the 27th April. Well done to all our students and thank you to the P&C for their support.

Da Vinci Decathlon

This term we continued to build on the already extensive learning opportunities on offer here at Leeton High School. Our focus on the High Potential and Gifted Education policy has broadened our perspective on the many ways students can demonstrate their talent and potential. We are working hard to explore additional ways in which we can enrich our students to be their best and we are discovering many new resources to assist this development as well. This term, we are entering two teams into the DaVinci Decathlon competing against other school online in the following areas: English, Creative Producers, Science and Ideation, Engineering Challenge, Mathematics, Art and Poetry and Cartography, Code Breaking and Legacy. Best wishes to our Year 7 and 8 and Year 9 and 10 teams. The DaVinci Decathlon commences in April.

Mental Health Education Program

On Tuesday and Wednesday students will participate in the Mental Health Education Program supported by Headspace. This program delivers free mental health education workshops to school communities across Australia. The workshops have been developed to increase awareness, knowledge and skills in mental health literacy, accessing support and improving wellbeing for students. Workshops are interactive, strength-based and evidence-informed. Local primary schools will also be joining us on the Wednesday to participate in the workshops on offer.

Athletics Carnival Wednesday 31st March and Thursday 1st April

Our Athletics carnival will run over the afternoon of Wednesday 31^{st} March and all day Thursday 1st April at the Leeton High School oval. Due to the large amount of students competing in other sporting events or the Year 7 Camp over the last week, or PE/sport staff have tried to accommodate other times to run events to keep the carnival to the current format. These alternate times have been listed on a Facebook page or read out during student notices. Parents and carers are welcome to attend but need to follow current physical distancing and hygiene practices and sign in procedures when at the oval. The school has a COVID Safety Plan for the event. Best wishes to all competitors!

Positive Behaviour for Learning

Students have been acknowledged 9.626 times for demonstrating positive behaviours so far this year. To celebrate, we will be holding an end of term MegaDraw. Next term our PBL weekly 30-minute lesson will focus on respectful and responsible behaviours through an anti-bullying and resilience program across Years 7-9. Students in Year 10 will commence an Academic Mentoring Program to best prepare them to undertake the transition into Year 11 in 2022. This program will support students in the subject selection process, to understand the requirements of courses, to explore ATAR and non ATAR study pathways, TAFE course options and more. This program will continue into Term 3. Year 11 and 12 will also explore a study-skills focus during their PBL lessons for Term 2.
